The Minor Prophets

Micah – Who is like Yahweh

Please pray and ask the Lord for understanding of His Word before you begin.

Read Micah Chapter 2

In chapter 1 Micah gives his first message declaring the sins of Samaria and Judah against God. He summons the nations of the world to witness a court case against Samaria and Judah with God as the Judge. Because He is the Lord of all the earth, the nations of the earth are being warned that judgment falls on all that sin against Him. Chapter 2 contains Micah's second message and lists the specific charges against Samaria and Judah.

Chapter 2 – Sins of the people towards one another

- 1. Read verses 1 and 2 along with Proverbs 3:27 and Exodus 20:17. What do you learn from these verses?
- 2. Look at verses 3-5 and explain what is being said. Deuteronomy 32:8 and 2 Kings 17:23,24 may help.
- 3. Read verse 6 along with verse 11 and Isaiah 30:10.
 - a. What do you learn?
 - b. Do you see this happening today in the Church?
- 4. What is being said in verse 7? Check John 8:39; Romans 2:28, 29; and 2 Timothy 3:5 for help with your answer.
- 5. List the wrongs being done to the people in verses 8 and 9.

- 6. Read verse 10 along with Joshua 23:15, 16.
 - a. What is God saying to the people?
 - b. Read Hebrews 4:1-9. What do you learn from this passage?
- 7. Read verse 11 and 2 Peter 2:1-3.
 - a. What do you learn?
 - b. What are some of the false teachings in the churches today?
 - c. How can we discern false prophecy (teaching)?
- 8. Chapter 2 ends on an encouraging note as Micah looks to the future of Israel.
 - a. What is God promising Israel and when will this be fulfilled? (Micah 4:6,7)
 - b. Who is verse 13 talking about?
