Read Micah Chapter 3 & 4

Chapter 3 – The Third Message

1. Read verses 1-4.

- a. Who is Micah addressing in these verses? (Ezekiel 22:27)
- b. What is he saying about them? (Psalm 14:4)
- c. What is the consequence of their actions?

2. Read verses 5-7.

- a. Now Micah addresses the prophets. What is he saying about them?
- b. What are the consequences of their sin?
- 3. Read verse 8 along with Acts 1:8 and 1 Corinthians 2:4.
 - a. What is Micah saying about himself?
 - b. Why is it essential for us to be filled with the Holy Spirit?
 - c. What happens when a church substitutes 'relevance' for the Holy Spirit?
- 4. In verses 9-12 Micah addresses the transgressions of both the political and religious leaders.
 - a. List the corrupt acts they are guilty of.

Chapter 4 – What the future holds

5. Verses 1-5 describe the coming thousand-year kingdom age of Jesus' reign on earth. What do you learn about this time from these verses?

6. What promises to Israel do you find in verses 6-8? (keeping in mind this is the millennial kingdom being described, the Hebrew term 'forever' doesn't always mean 'without end' but rather a length of time determined by the context.)

7. Micah changes his focus to a coming judgment against Judah. Read verses 9, 10 along with 2 Chronicles 36:15-23.

- 8. Micah switches gears again in verses 11-13. Read these verses along with Joel 3:9-15.
 - a. What event is being described?

9. Was there a verse or a passage from chapter 3 or 4 that made an impression on you?
