The Minor Prophets

Micah – Who is like Yahweh

Please pray and ask the Lord for understanding of His Word before you begin.

Read Micah Chapter 5

1. Read verse 1 along with Deuteronomy 29:47-52. What do you learn? (The horrific impact of the siege is described in verses 53-57)

2. The name Bethlehem means 'house of bread'. Read verse 2 along with these and tell what you learn.

- a. 1 Corinthians 1:27,28 –
- b. John 6:35 –
- c. Luke 1:31-33 –
- d. Psalm 90:2 –
- e. John 1:1-3 –

3. Verse 3 speaks of a future time in Israel, which was partially fulfilled during the Babylonian exile but will be finalized during the Tribulation. During this time, before the restoration, it will seem as though the Lord is distant from Israel. But read Micah 4:10 and tell what you learn.

4. Look at verses 4 and Psalm 23:1,2; Isaiah 40:10,11 and John 10:27-30 and write down what you learn.

5. Read verse 5a along with Ephesians 2:14. Is there anything in your life that you are not at peace with? Read John 14:27.

6. In verses 5b and 6 Micah speaks again of future events (even though Assyria is coming against Israel,) this reference is to **any** enemy of God's people.

A. Read Isaiah 44:28.

b. Can you name a few leaders that God has raised up to protect His people in modern times?

7. What do you learn about the remnant of Jacob that the Lord delivers when He restores Israel? (verses 7-9)

8. Verses 10-15 describes Israel in the Millennial Age.

- a. What is God's purpose in doing these things?
- b. What is He going to require of the other nations of the earth?
