In other words, when John says, “he who does good”, and “he who does evil”, the Greek tense speaks of those who continually practice good, or they continually practice evil. If “practice makes perfect”, what are some healthy practices we should include in our lives to help keep us growing in our walk with Jesus? See Heb 10:24 & 25; Acts 2:42; Eph 4:30–5:2; Eph 5:15–21; Col 3:12–17; 1 Peter 4:7–11; 2 Tim 2:20–26; Phil 4:8 & 9
