"Struck Down: Saul's Salvation"

Acts 9:1-19

Getting to know each other thru the Word:

1) Every Christian has a testimony as to how Jesus saved them. Not everyone has a dramatic testimony like the Apostle Paul, but everyone's salvation is a story of God's grace and love. What is your testimony? Can you share it in 2 minutes or less?

2) A disciple, named Ananias, was told by Jesus to go and lay hands on Saul of Tarsus and to pray for his eyesight to be restored and that he would be filled with the Holy Spirit. For various reasons, Ananias was nervous about doing this. Have you ever had the Lord ask you to do something that made you feel nervous? What was it? How did it turn out?

Getting into the Word:

3) When Saul says in Acts 9:6, "Lord, what do You want me to do?"...it was at that moment he surrendered his life, and his will, over to Jesus. Saul of Tarsus (an enemy of Jesus), would become the Apostle Paul (the friend and servant of Jesus). Becoming a Christian, which means "a little follower of Christ", includes surrendering every part of our lives over to the Lord Jesus. What do the following verses say about this?

Luke 9:23-25...Matt.7:21...Acts 5:27-29...Rom.12:1-2...Rom.14:7-9...1Cor.6:19-20...Gal.2:20...Phil.2:12-13...
1John 2:15-17.

4) Was there anything from Sunday's message that encouraged you, challenged you, confused you, or brought up more questions in your mind?
